Effecting Positive Change

in our Communities

This report speaks to FedPoint's dedication to making a meaningful difference in both the communities we serve and the lives of those we touch—our employees, customers, neighbors, partners, and countless others.

As a federal and military benefits contractor, we operate locally and also have a far-reaching national, and even global, footprint. Our corporate citizenship extends from our company headquarters on the New Hampshire Seacoast to Washington, D.C., and across the U.S., where our business partners and the customers we serve work and live, and beyond. This helps to inform our approach to community giving, which borrows in part from the popular "think globally, act locally" principle.

In practice this means investing in causes and organizations in our own backyard that are important to our employees, while complementing these efforts with support for more national organizations that help improve the lives of the federal family members we serve.

There may be no better example of this localnational approach than FedPoint's investments in education.

• In 2023, we awarded our first FedPoint Nursing Scholarships of \$5,000 each to four high-achieving students pursuing degrees in the nursing profession. FedPoint's commitment to the future of the nursing workforce in New England and beyond was lauded by New Hampshire Governor Chris Sununu and serves as a great example of a local community effort, as FedPoint's care coordination team and our community partners from Cornerstone VNA in Rochester helped to identify the recipients from more than 100 other applicants across New Hampshire, Maine, and Massachusetts.



• While our FedPoint Nursing Scholarship awards were a local first in 2023, last year marked our 15th consecutive year supporting the national Federal Employee Education & Assistance Fund (FEEA) Scholarship program. FedPoint's support for the program has helped provide more than 400 merit-based scholarships for children and family members of federal employees across the country (with 25%+ awarded to recipients right here in New England), helping many recipients to become the first in their family to attend college.

The heart and soul of our community engagement has always started with our people. Throughout this report, you'll discover stories of positive impact directly resulting from our employees' involvement —from nonprofit board service with organizations like Leadership Seacoast, Cornerstone VNA, and I Got Bridged to record number turnouts for United Way's Day of Caring, to FedPoint's own Nicole Bernarducci receiving the 2023 Easterseals NH Volunteer of the Year award.

I continue to be proud and grateful for our employees' generosity and service. It's one thing to work for a good company. It's another to work for a company that does good. It's an extremely fortunate circumstance to work for a company that embodies both. I hope as you browse this report you feel the same.

2023 by the Numbers

FedPoint's community giving was far reaching in 2023, with \$250,000 in support provided to more than 80 non-profit organizations spanning New Hampshire and the greater Seacoast to Washington, D.C. and beyond. Our community partners program made up 25% of our total giving, with funds helping to support local nonprofit organizations chosen in part by FedPoint employees via our annual giving survey.

FedPoint employees also drove our monthly charity selections and voted for our Survey Says charities, directing funds to combat the social issues that mattered to them most such as homelessness, food insecurity, substance abuse, domestic and sexual violence, to name a few.

How We Give

Our philanthropic program is structured to support the community in a variety of ways, as shown below. This structure enables us to understand the needs of the nonprofits we assist and support their initiatives, while empowering our employees to support the community causes they most care about through both financial assistance and inperson volunteerism.



Corporate Donations

FedPoint supports a core group of community partner organizations that impact change in areas important to employees and supports them through sustained financial contributions.



Survey Says

Choosing from a list of organizations suggested by employees in FedPoint's annual giving survey, employees vote for one organization each month to receive a company donation.



Employee-requested Donations

Each year, employees can request a donation of up to \$500 to a nonprofit of their choice.



Sponsorships

FedPoint invests in sponsorships that help nonprofits aligned with the causes employees believe are important.



Matching Gifts

Employees are able to double their giving by submitting for a match up to \$100 annually for qualified nonprofit organizations.



Volunteerism

Employees are provided 16 hours of paid time off per year to volunteer in the community at a nonprofit of their choice.

FedPoint has been a longtime partner of the Granite United Way, supporting its mission to bring people and resources together to create positive and lasting change in our communities.


K-READY Kids

Since 2014, FedPoint has supported the K-Ready Kids campaign, which helps prepare children and their families for kindergarten by providing readiness backpacks filled with age-appropriate materials to help them thrive in school, such as books, materials to help build fine motor skills, and activities and resources that help parents learn more about where their child is developmentally.

Each year FedPoint employees use their volunteer hours to help pack the backpacks and ready them for distribution to the children at area preschools before the summer break.







Each year FedPoint is partnered with four to six nonprofits, and employees volunteer help them with various projects such as landscaping and gardening, painting, organization, basic repairs, and even building playground areas.





Community Partner

Leadership Seacoast

To promote civic engagement, FedPoint has encouraged its employees to take part in Leadership Seacoast, a nonprofit organization dedicated to enriching and inspiring both emerging and existing leaders within the New Hampshire Seacoast.

Through its programming, Leadership Seacoast aims to build a stronger community for all by engaging and inspiring people to lead positive changes in their community.

FedPoint shares in that mission, and has partnered with and supported Leadership Seacoast since 2015 by supporting the organization through sponsorship, as well as supporting employees who apply and are accepted into the program.

We believe participation in Leadership Seacoast provides our employees with a unique opportunity to not only learn the inner-workings of the issues affecting the Seacoast, but also expands their network with local influencers.

Participants commit to a seven-month community leadership program, where regional issues are examined through the perspectives of experts, on-site visits, readings, discussion groups, problem-solving exercises, and other experiential activities. Participants explore and examine key issues impacting the cultural, social, political and economic lives of Seacoast residents.

More than 20 FedPoint employees have graduated from Leadership Seacoast. Many have gone on to serve on nonprofit boards (including Leadership Seacoast's own board of directors), or become active members of nonprofit committees.





Investing in Education

FedPoint Nursing Scholarship

The FedPoint Nursing Scholarship was established in an effort to attract qualified candidates to the profession and support our next generation of nurses.

Four \$5,000 scholarships are awarded annually to graduating high school seniors who currently reside in either New Hampshire, Maine, or Massachusetts and are accepted into accredited nursing programs.

As a company that employs more than 35 full-time nurses, offering the annual scholarships is our way of affirming, supporting, and expressing our gratitude to those who wish to become nurses, and raise awareness that nursing remains a rewarding career path with strong prospects now and in the future.

It's also a chance for us to make a meaningful financial contribution to their training, and serve as a token of our gratitude to those who commit to this venerable field.

Our first year accepting applications was 2023, and we received more than 100 applications our inaugural year—ultimately choosing the four winners who stood out from the field for demonstrating a strong work ethic, passion for community, academic rigor, and heartfelt desire to help improve the lives of others by pursuing a career in nursing.

Each year scholarship recipients are announced during National Nurses Week.

Investing in Education

Federal Employee Education & Assistance Fund

Our investment in education goes beyond our local community. As a federal contractor, we have also committed to supporting members of the federal family through our philanthropic efforts.

One way we do so is through our partnership with the Federal Employees Education & Assistance Fund (FEEA), whose mission is to empower federal and postal employees and their families to achieve their educational, financial, and career goals as they serve the American people.

Since 2007, FedPoint has partnered with FEEA and annually contributes \$62,500 to their merit scholarship program, which awards merit-based scholarships to federal employees, their spouses, children, and grandchildren. Our donation supports 50 scholarships annually.

FedPoint's financial contribution toward the scholarship fund has helped provide more than 400 merit-based scholarships for children and family members of federal employees across the country, helping many recipients to become the first in their family to attend college.

To date, FEEA has awarded more than 11,500 scholarships to date, totaling over \$14 million to federal employees and their families. We are proud to play a small role in helping to provide educational opportunities for federal families.
